

Sustainability analyst

As a Sustainability Analyst, you will provide impactful advice on sustainable strategic developments to our clients. Kick-start your career at WSP!

Description of the job

Within our new advisory team you will work on purpose-driven projects as a full team member from day one. This gives you plenty of room to develop your professional, technical and commercial skills, both in the Netherlands and internationally. Due to the wide variety of projects, large and small, you will quickly learn a lot. You will also be guided in your development from the start by your buddy and mentor and will be involved in team briefings and client updates.

Your day at WSP begins after a cup of tea or coffee with getting together with your colleagues to discuss current and upcoming work. In the projects you will be involved in analysing new ideas, preparing risk analyses and modelling and visualizing cash flows. You will also work on business cases, due diligence reports and buy or sell-side transaction support. This is what a typical day of a Sustainability Analyst at WSP looks like

9:00 - You review the bid for the new project in depth to see exactly what work will be done in the coming weeks. This is a project in which an airport has asked WSP how best to make it sustainable. Some terms you don't recognize; you quickly Google these and thus learn 'on the job'!

10:00 - During the project's online Kick-off meeting, you and your colleagues from the Advisory Team and the client introduce yourselves to each other. Led by your supervisor, you and the client discuss the schedule and ask for specific dates and data from the client for the project. After the call, you discuss with your colleagues how the call went, and work is distributed within the team.

11:30 - You get to work looking up information on relevant European and local legislation related to CO2 emissions and airport sustainability. You also come across a lot about subsidies; you call your colleague who took on that part to tell him what you found. He is happy with you, this saves him a lot!

14:00 - After lunch, you incorporate all the relevant regulations and information into the report. You call your project leader to tell him what you found and ask if you missed anything; he points out a new EU rule and asks you to dig into it further.

15:00 - The department director has spent the past few days writing a project proposal for a large, international client. The client expects the project proposal from WSP by 17:00 at the latest, and the director asks you to go through it critically and is curious if you find everything clear and if you can think of any additions. From your education, you happen to have a lot of experience with this subject, and you tip him off about a particular analysis method. He is happy with this; after you add some slides about this, the proposal goes to the client. Hopefully, you win the project!

17:30 - The hours have flown by, because your day is already over. Does it happen to be a Friday? Then have a drink with your colleagues, because that's part of the job too!
